

Car Care Tips

When putting your car away for the winter, don't forget the small things like making sure the battery is disconnected (this is what I would do) or at least pull the fuse to the radio, a small draw on the battery will kill it and if it loses its charge it will freeze. Especially if you do not have it in a heated garage. I like to put a little extra air pressure in the tires to help stop them from flat spotting. Make sure the antifreeze is good so it will not freeze and make sure your windshield washer is not full of summer bug fluid or water, this will freeze and you will not have a windshield washer next year. Fill your car with gas to help cut down on condensation.

Clean your car inside and give her a bath and it would not hurt to wax it and put the cover on her. It's a good idea to start your Corvette up every couple of months and run for at least 15 minutes. Don't forget to run the air conditioning; this helps prevent the seals from drying out. It's also a good idea to put it in gear and move it a few feet or better yet, if the road is clear and you have insurance on it, take her for a drive. This will help keep everything lubricated and in ship shape for the spring. I like to buy a couple of cans of Rust Check (you can buy it at Home Hardware) to spray on the frame and any other metal parts you don't want to rust. I spray it on my chrome rims to help keep them from rusting; the stuff washes right off with soap and water in the spring.

Some like to change the oil & filter in the fall, I like to wait until spring that way if there is any condensation in the oil I will get rid of it.

Don't forget winter is the best time to get the big stuff looked at, transmission job, motor work, paint job, you don't want to have to miss any events next year waiting for your Corvette to be ready.

Take care and have a great Easter. Look on the bright side only 2 months and we will have the babies out again.

GM recalling some 22,000 Corvettes over removable roof problems

The recall, which was announced this month and begins in January, applies to 2005-2007 Chevrolet Corvettes and 2006-2007 Corvette Z06's with removable roofs.

The NHTSA says the adhesive between the roof panel and frame can separate, which would cause noise, poor fit and water leakage. If the adhesive completely separates, the roof panel could come off the car.

Dealers will install a new roof panel free of charge for affected cars, the NHTSA said.



MONTANA STATE TROOPER
