
Jenna and Andrew Porter's Bio





Annual General Meeting October 22, 2023

A group of 38 people were welcomed by President Ivan Hines during his opening remarks.

ZO6 & ZR1: Every Z-for-Zora Corvette Ever Made!

With the new C8 ZR1 on the way, we take a look back at all of the previous Z06 and ZR1 models.

Intro

The Corvette world is on pins and needles waiting for all the details on the new C8 ZR1. With that future model in the news right now, we thought this would be a good time to look back at all the wonderful Z06 and ZR1 Corvettes that came before it. And the man who inspired the prominent use of the letter Z. It is the success of these earlier models that make the C8 ZR1 possible. If you can't get an allocation for the new Z06 or ZR1, any of the cars on this list would make an excellent consolation prize.

1963 Z06

The Z06 that started it all. RPO Z06 in 1963 would add about 50 percent to the price of a standard Corvette. But for the money you got what was essentially a factory race car. You got an upgraded suspension, brakes, and of course the 360 horsepower L84 engine. Only 199 of these cars were ever made.

1970 - 1972 ZR1


In 1970 Chevrolet offered the first ZR1 package for the Corvette. It came with a 370 horsepower LT1 V-8 engine as well as a host of other performance upgrades. This tends to be the forgotten ZR1 as many believe the first Corvette ZR1 came out in 1990. Perhaps that is why this example failed to sell at a Mecum auction a number of years ago.

1990 – 1995 ZR1

The C4-generation ZR1 is a special car. Of course, you can say that about any ZR1, but the C4 car broke the mold for GM. The LT5 engine was like nothing else ever seen under the hood of a Corvette. It was developed by Chevrolet and Lotus and was the first DOHC engine in Corvette history. It originally produced 375 horsepower and was then upgraded to 405 horsepower in 1993. This made the ZR1 one of the most powerful cars in the world at the time.

2001 – 2004 Z06

After a nearly 40-year absence the Corvette Z06 returned in 2001. The car made 385 horsepower and could get to 60 mph in a little over 4 seconds. Top speed was nearly 170 mph. These are astounding numbers for 2001. In 2002 the car got a little stronger and made 405 horsepower. These cars could hit 60 in less than 4 seconds and run the quarter mile in the low 11-second range. These cars also featured a titanium exhaust that sounds great and a suspension that made sure this Corvette could do more than just accelerate in a straight line. These are some of the best Corvette models ever made.









2006 – 2013 Z06

In 2006 things started to get serious. The C6 Z06 was now making 505 horsepower thanks to the new 7.0L V-8 engine. With these cars the Corvette began to be spoken of in the same sentence as exotics such as the Ferrari F430.

2009 – 2013 ZR1

In 2009 GM threw down the gauntlet and put the sports car world on notice with the C6 ZR1. The supercharged LS9 V-8 made a gaudy 638 horsepower. The car topped out at over 200 mph. It is true that this Corvette crossed the six-figure price threshold with an MSRP of \$105K. But if you wanted performance like this from any other car, you would need to pay substantially more. The C6 ZR1 was actually a performance bargain.

2015 - 2019 Z06

In 2015 the C7-generation Corvette got a Z06 variant. And this car was a monster. 650 horsepower came from the supercharged LT4. Certain body panels were made of carbon fiber, magnetorheological dampers were standard. This was not just a Corvette with a big engine, this was a sophisticated performance machine. And thanks to the available manual transmission, some people believe that this is still the ultimate Z06.

2019 ZR1

GM decided to build themselves a super car. That super car was the 2019 ZR1. The LT5 engine is aided by a supercharger and makes an absurd 755 horsepower and 715 pound-feet of torque. Top speed is north of 212 mph. 60 mph is reached in 3 seconds flat. And the car is capable of setting blistering lap times. This is a performance icon that became collectible the day it was released.

2023 – Current Z06

What else can we say about the current Z06? The flat-plane crank LT6 engine is a game changer. This car is a track weapon that is capable of embarrassing cars that cost two or three times as much. We will likely never see a Corvette like this again. The car is a hero today, and the legend will only grow over time.

2025 C8 ZR1

The upcoming C8 ZR1 is still an unknown. Rumored to have 800+ HP and even more aero than the C8 Z06. This rendered spy shot gives a glimpse of what's to come.
